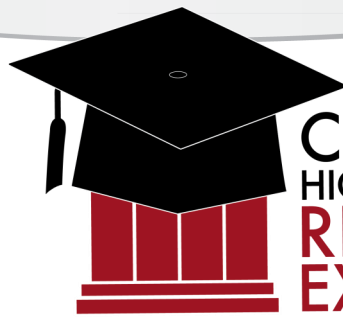
CHERE has conducted nearly 20 conferences hosted by educational institutions throughout Connecticut, on a range of critical and cutting-edge issues facing higher education.
