TOPICS FOR DISCUSSION

What's the Issue? For example, continuous, substantive, individually-tailored communications and counseling support in high school (and before), during summer after graduation (to avoid "summer melt"), and all through college. How can challenged students (e.g., first generation, underpresented) be kept "in the counseling loop?" Who's responsible?

Counseling vs. Coaching: What's the difference? "Emotional" vs. "social" and/or academic?

Reducing summer melt: who's responsible? High schools? CBOs? Colleges where students have been accepted (including role of bridge programs) – How to fill the gap between high school and college? Importance of multimedia communications geared to the age group.

How can we provide meaningful, timely communication and counseling to adult learners?

Caseloads: too high in higher ed, way too high in high school, especially schools serving underrepresented, first gen and otherwise challenged students – any short-term solutions (e.g., policy changes at local and State level, more funding – source?)

What do we do about more challenged students?

More funding and staffing (trained counselors) at both levels. More and better professional development for both counselors and faculty -- enlisting faculty as "closet counselors – how? Role of summer bridge programs: Filling the Gap. Importance of communicating with parents of traditional age students, and sometimes with the families of adult learners.
